There is no other time in the Christian calendar where the world is more receptive to the good news of Jesus than at Christmas time.


If shops and retailers can promote Christmas so brashly why as Christians can we not want to invite others to "Come and See", what the story of Christmas is about?

Our younger son, Timothy, moved to Blackpool in late June and we have travelled up to see him several times. Keith will be 82 years old in January and we know that we cannot do that journey for many more years. We have found another park home in Blackpool and while we are able, we feel this is the right time to go.

We move in early December.

I would also like to thank everyone who has come on my coach trips to some wonderful places over the last 10 years since I retired.

Rev Dan writes

After another Summer of considerable engagement with children, youth and families –those under-represented in churches – we've had an Autumn of growth. In the context of mission, Paul writes to the Colossian church "make the most of every opportunity". Paul was fully aware, as we are, that not everyone responds to Jesus, his love, death, resurrection, call to love one another and church itself.

So, thank you for all your mission through the week enabling people to know God's unstoppable love.

Building on excellent past and present ministry with older people in homes, care homes and hospitals, we've held Dream Kingdom Dreams events exploring areas of development.

We've also held Myers Briggs Personality workshops enabling greater understanding of our identity, preferences and interactions with others: dynamics which help in our mission and ministry.

We have engagement with all our wonderful schools: including Collective Worship, a film club at Abbey School and lunchtime chatting. We're preparing for another moving Experience Christmas for all six primary schools in our churches run by church volunteers where a class of 8–11-year-olds experience five activities in small groups exploring the Christmas story.

We've been working with The Children's Society conducting their Well-being Survey across Swale Borough Council's Eastern Area. These results will help enormously figure out future priorities with other agencies in the area.

Our Gem72 mobile ministry is growing, now visiting Davington Top Park, Faversham Rec, Selling, Sheldwich, Lower Road's Ospringe Park, Market Square and Love Lane estate.

We partner with Brogdale CIC's Vibe for some sessions and some we run as the benefice. All sessions connect with our engagement in schools.

We now have a weekly benefice gathering called i.wonder for children, young people and families to participate in worship and discipleship. We welcome between 20-30 at Davington Church at 4pm including some from trailer sessions and schools who have no contact with church.

We're rehearsing for Singalong Christmas (Saturdays at 6pm at St Mary of Charity Church). It's the Christmas story presented through songs from recent decades, puppets and lots of audience participation. Performance: 6pm, Monday 19 th December at St Mary of Charity Church.

Another season of Faversham Gems Awards is on its way in January 2023 celebrating children and young people who Go Extra Miles and make life sparkle. The Going Extra Miles concept comes from Jesus and last year over 90 young people were commended for selflessly giving of themselves for others.

Who could you nominate between 1st January and 28th February at favershamgems.org?

Paul also writes about being prayerfully watchful for an open door to share God's good news.

Many people have no idea about this best news in the world. Thank you for making the most of every opportunity to enable people to know God's unstoppable love.

So I for one will look forward with hope that our community will find in us flawed humans the image of God leading a life of service renewed every time we worship and renew our lives in the sharing of bread and wine in Holy Communion.


