Revd. Simon writes

Within the Anglican calendar we remember on the 8th of May, Julian of Norwich, an anchoress who was attached to the church of St Julian in Norwich. We know little detail of her

actual life, she is known by the churches dedication to which she is associated, Julian was not her given name. Her year of birth was possibly 1342 and her death was unrecorded. We do know according to the British Library from one surviving document, a

manuscript, dated 1413, describes her as a 'Julyan that is recluse ate Norwyche and zitt on lyfe' (Julian, who is a recluse in Norwich and is alive).

Julian of Norwich wrote the first work in the English language which we can be sure was authored by a woman. This remarkable achievement sets her apart in the medieval period. Her writing, The Revelation of Divine Love, is today considered a theological and spiritual classic based upon the mystical revelations she received. It has the central theme of the assurance of God's love. Living in a time of extreme uncertainty including the plague she writes, "Here I was taught by the grace of God that I should steadfastly hold me in the Faith ... and that ... I should take my stand on and earnestly believe in ... that 'all manner of thing shall be well"' (The Revelations of Divine Love, Chapter 32).

Here was a Christian person totally assured by God's love for her and humanity. In our unsettled times, and I write after three APCM's where it has become increasingly difficult to



find volunteers to take on responsibilities. We find congregations growing more mature in years, and in the midst of this we need to be reminded that we **exist in God's time and** economy of grace. The text from Ecclesiastes 3.1-8 of times and season

comes immediately to mind. Have trust in God and awaiting in his grace with faith and hope is both the Old **Testament writers and Julian's** message. When we sit and worry about change in church and society, we need to remember we trust in an eternal God. Easy to say but harder to live in such faith.

As the new church lived amid the death and resurrection of Christ, they awaited the coming of the Holy Spirit. Like them as we celebrate the feast of Pentecost let us pray for a spirit of renewal and disruption to comfortable lives that the Spirit of God may motivate us to new and different lives in Christ. Julian had a deep faith and trust in God and would speak to us across time and say, "in God all will be well". Yours in Christ

Our new Benefice website - launching soon:

We're nearly ready to launch our new Faversham Benefice website. Here's a bit about it.

• What will it look like?

It's a bright, friendly and helpful addition in our mission and ministry toolbox with pages for the four churches and links to/from each church's social media and *achurchnearyou.com* accounts. All gathered under one banner, "The Church of England in Faversham".

From the home page one can easily see church location, happy congregation, service pattern and where the 5th Sunday Benefice services are (although the website won't be able to cater for those who turn up to a locked door of the other churches that morning.)

Each church's link will take you to the church's page where you'll find details of the church's team, regular services, open church times, activities and a link to the Parish Giving Scheme. These are also displayed on a separate benefice "what's on" page.

As with Keeping Contact, event organisers will submit details about events to be advertised. There will be a history page for each church and each congregation will be able to suggest further pages for their church page (which may then become a prototype for the other churches!)

• Links

We have many links from our website for instance, the Church of England Daily Prayer services and app, our church schools, Church of England pages about baptism, confirmation, weddings, funerals, our children's and families mission and ministry etc - all within easy reach of benefice contact details which, unlike many webpages, are clearly found on every page.

There will also be an easy-to-use contact form.

Parish safeguarding information is one click away as is the requirement of all Church of England churches.

We even have an archive page with past issues of Keeping Contact and all our online ministry such as Contemplating Easter and Contemplating Christmas and online services.

Maximum flexibility

The website has been designed for maximum versatility and more pages can easily be added. We will be found in searches and we have a website for laptops/desktops and another for mobile use.

• Why can't we launch right now?

First, there are certain details which *must* appear before we go live. Second, church websites which have lots of photos of people make those churches much more approachable and accessible.

Each congregation is being photographed waving at the camera so that the church isn't only seen to be a building. It is hoped that those who hold responsibility in the churches will have a photo online. Such a website involving a lot of people will also have to be approved through the correct channels and all this takes time. The web address will be publicised widely.

Look out for our new 24/7 mission and ministry online soon.

Cathedral Passes 2023

Those of us who have held Precincts Passes for Canterbury Cathedral over the past few years (or decades) may be sorry to hear that as of February this year, the passes are no longer valid.

The cathedral has relaunched the scheme, now with charges, as Cathedral Passes.

The criteria for passes is anyone who:

- * works in the old city of Canterbury;
- * lives within four miles of Bell Harry tower, including within The Precincts;
- is a member of the cathedral congregation;
- * is immediate family of a cathedral staff member;
- is a cathedral volunteer; or
- * is a member of any church in the diocese (on the parish electoral roll or similar)

The last qualification is how most of us will have obtained our passes in the first place. The new passes are valid for five years and will cost £6 (the equivalent of 10p a month). As well as a physical pass you will also get a digital pass (how very 21st Century!) If you wish to apply for a pass you need to go to www.canterbury-cathedral.org/visit.

You will need to have proof of your eligibility in order to complete your application. You can also email the Cathedral on passes@canterbury-cathedral.org or telephone 01227 762862. There are no discounts!

A cause for reflection



'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3 v 16) appears at the top of this embroidery.

Below which is a copy of the face of Christ (with the crown of thorns) from a late fifteenth century German painting on papier-mache. Underneath you can view lists of sins expressed in red stitching. These sins begin to disappear as they near the bottom of the screen. The threads have been snipped, some pulled out. Eventually there are no words but simply holes where the threads have been removed.

And look below in white stitching are words from the prophet Isaiah

''Though your sins are as scarlet they shall be as white as snow.' (Isaiah1verse 18)

We visited Spratton Church during Holy week where they had 10 embroidery's based on the Stations of the Cross. These embroideries by Jacqui Parkinson were profoundly moving and I am sure I would get something different whenever I view them.

The one to the left I found very thought provoking as I contemplated the effect that sins have on our world and the people within it. The concept that although our hurtful actions are forgiven their effect is still left behind. I was reminded of the meeting between Jesus and Thomas where Jesus says to Thomas place your hands in my wounds.

He is Risen but still bears the scars of His ordeal as we, and the people we hurt, do. Our hope is in the forgiveness we give and receive and our commitment to follow Him in Spirit and Truth, renewed as we are by the broken bread and wine, healing the sick and caring for the broken hearted.
