From Simon our Priest

One of my favourite bible passages is in Mark's Gospel. The story of Jesus' encounter with blind Bartimaeus (Mark 10:46-52.)

Bartimaeus is clearly aware of Jesus presence and causes a commotion, whether because he was being ignored or simply to attract Jesus attention. He calls out "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Jesus is simply not Jesus but Bartimaeus uses the messianic title 'The Son of David'. He has faith in who Jesus is even if he is physically blind to the world around him.

Mark is pointing out there are plenty who can see and yet do not see what is right in front of them, both then and now. The second part of Bartimaeus' call is one of asking for forgiveness, 'have mercy on me' what does he want or expect from Jesus one wonders? I like this episode in the Gospel because so often I am blind to what God is doing and can do in the world around me. As a leader of a church community vou would expect a areater degree of faith in your Vicar. Yet all of us can be worn down by the cynicism of the world and its values based on power and wealth. This is where the second part of the joy of this Gospel story comes in. The Jesus Praver is a treasurer from

Orthodox Christendom. It is based around Bartimaeus call to Jesus. Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, "Have mercy on me (a sinner)"

It is a simple prayer for quietly repeating. It says who Jesus is in relation to the Father and why he came to set us free from our sins and is our justification before God.

It is both simple and yet profound based upon a Gospel (good news text). By repeating the prayer, we can centre ourselves before we enter a time of focused prayer.

When our minds become distracted by a commotion or we want to refocus our attention / prayer on Jesus we can enter the repetition of the prayer. It can be used in a group or a circle of people each repeating it quietly in turn or by an individual whilst controlling their breathing around the prayer to focus on God through Christ.

Blind Bartimaeus was healed when he cried out to Jesus in faith. When I pray the Jesus prayer I pray for fresh vision in the world and for forgiveness, the prayer has brought me much healing.

Why not give the prayer a try as part of your prayer routine? Begin with reading Mark 10:46-52 close your eyes imagine yourself with the disciples and call out to Jesus. Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God. "Have mercy on me (a sinner)".

You will be amazed at the response.

There have been a number of auestions raised over church services in the Benefice. As we prepared to reopen churches at the beginning of July we were planning unsighted of Government and National Church quidelines until very late in the day.

A good number of other churches made the decision not to open until the beginning of September. Thanks to Wardens who have invested a large amount of time in preparing pages of health and safety assessments required by National church guidance to ensure safe limited opening. My guiding principal is both safety and accessibility. The online services allow the greatest access to the most number of parishioners and thanks to Dan and others hard work will continue. A communion

service at 10am once a month in each church has been arrange and provided for. On the alternative Sundays lay led morning prayer where requested has been offered in some but not all churches. As previously stated online remain the focus as we feel our way forward in these uncertain times. The hope of returning to a greater degree of normality in September at this stage only remains a hope but we will be guided by National church advice and maintaining online services and monthly communions in each church.

Finally a personal note of thanks to the volunteers who worked so hard to clean the four churches in preparation for reopening.

Getting to know you

Hello, my name is Maureen Gregory I am a member of Davington in the Benefice of Faversham

1 How long have you been in Faversham, have you ever lived anywhere else?

I was born in Faversham (Hillside House) & spent my childhood on a farm in

Teynham before starting nurse training in Kingston upon Thames fresh from school at 18. My nursing career was mainly in outer London but I spent 2 years in Scotland before I returned to Faversham & married in 1981. I lived in Stonebridge Way before moving to my father's bungalow 3 years ago after the death of both my husband & father. Faversham has always been a very special community for me.

2 How did you come to your faith?

I loved the church services whilst at Teynham C of E School as lunch always included gypsy tart after the long walk back! I quit Confirmation prep as I missed my mum's hot baking & my love of food has continued. I did not come to faith until after my daughter's wedding at Davington in 2007 although my experiences during NHS burn out were possibly nudging me to faith earlier as did the Holman Hunt painting 'Light of the world' which portrays Jesus knocking at an overgrown & long unopened door. At the time I was fearful of opening it (whether or not food was involved!)

Davington filled me with such peace I realised I could open that door!!I was Confirmed in 2008 & then embarked on Lay Ministry in Mission Enabling, loving to meet folk "where they're at".

COVID-19 disrupted over 10 years of Mother & Toddler group involvement & now I am about to serve Davington as Church Warden. I'm Verger for weddings & Baptisms & love rainbows &



Noah's Ark to portray God's love for all of us, whether worshipping regularly or not!!

3 What do you like most about your home church?

It's very special & I can feel the Benedictine worship from its rich past. My parents married there in 1943 & little had changed when my daughter also married there. I

had married at the Brents where my two children were also Baptised before it closed

It's very odd to be semi-detached with a special neighbour in the Priory but it is all part of life's rich pattern!?

4 What's your favourite hymn or chorus?

My favourites are 'Be Still for the Presence of the Lord' & 'As the deer pants for the water' but like Jane I love Matt Redman 10,000 Reasons, Bless the Lord. Just don't ask me to choose one favourite as I can dither well!!

5 What is your favourite bit of the Bible and why?

It has to be 1 Corinthians 12 'one body with many members' although at PCC meetings I am often quoting the parable of the mustard seed Matt13; 31 -32.

My mum used to say "treat everyone as you'd like to be treated" even though I didn't realise it was biblical!!

No one is anymore important than another & we are all different but still special to God. Just share the love & be kind ALWAYS.

The 72 bus and the GEM Trailer

This Autumn we have the exciting opportunity to provide activities, games and hospitality in locally on board The 72 bus and The Gem trailer.

The 72 is named after the Bible story in Luke 10 where Jesus sends out 72 disciples with the good news that God's Kingdom is at hand "in the neighbourhood" (although some translations only mention 70) and The GEM stands for Going Extra Miles – one of Jesus' teachings in the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5.



The 72 and The Gem will be "vehicles" for building community in and around Faversham especially in areas bringing hope and wholeness to neighbourhoods often feeling marginalised, hopeless and broken.

Primarily serving young people and children during evenings, weekends and holidays. They will also be available to schools and community groups.

Like the 72 disciples sent out as visitors into people's neighbourhoods, mobile youth team members become visitors in neighbourhoods too. Open conversations happen very naturally with all ages around the hospitality and activities, groups eagerly wait for the team to arrive each week and help set up and tidy up afterwards and community is built. There have been accounts of young people being inspired into education or employment, away from crime, and who have been helped through tough family times too.

Speaking about a previously run mobile initiative...

"...the outreach work conducted by the games trailer had a significant impact on youth-related antisocial behaviour and public engagement, helping to offer real solutions to community issues.

South East Coachworks. The 72 has been designed by SEC from ideas submitted by Queen Elizabeth and Abbey School students. There will be further opportunities to engage young people as part of the running of this crucial mobile initiative.

With solar panel and battery technology they will both provide hospitality on board Between them they offer a kitchen area, outdoor games equipment, desking, screens, game consoles, recording studio, mobile staging with lighting and a big-screen film showing capability.


