Revd. Simon writes

Meeting God in the silence.

Often 'doing church' is the activity of meeting fellow friends and other parishioners at church on a Sunday morning or the many voluntary tasks performed by so many kindhearted and generous people who give of their time in the care of the church. But meeting God in prayer or contemplative meditation / silence requires time which can be a real challenge. We live such busy lives and friends who are now retired tell me frequently how busy their lives have become. Parents with children must balance demanding jobs with the challenge of childcare. With us all growing older some people find themselves looking after grandchildren and older parents. How can we find time for space and time for our relationship with God?

This form of daily prayer allows time for a period of silence within the service itself. It has been known for the service to prayed by the Vicar in the car parked up during the day between visits or other events. Simply finding time to dwell in God's presence, being centered on him who loves us requires time and intentionally organized to set prayer and silence with God as a priority.

In addition to this daily prayer routine, I find the centering prayer, The Jesus Prayer a simple and helpful way of calming or focusing my mind before entering into a time of silence of prayer.

The Jesus Prayer is very simple:

"Lord Jesus Christ Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner," and is prayed repeatedly until the mind is calm and we can focus on God rather than the jumble of our thoughts.

So can I invite you all to spend time in silence with God in prayer and contemplation and pray for our four church communities and God's grace this coming Pentecost.

Words, Words....: a Lenten reflection.

One of the most beautiful verses in the bible is, in my mind at least, the phrase, 'in the beginning was the word'.

It is by words that we communicate our thoughts and ideas and what makes us human. Yet I was reminded again recently about the inadequacies in the English language, rich though it be, when we read biblical stories. The story being expounded upon was the rehabilitation of Simon Peter and the use of the word love in the recorded exchange between Jesus and Peter. Our word love does not cover the range of emotions covered in the Greek and bring out the nuances of the story.

It got me thinking about our use of words and how they have changed over the years as I read a poem entitled 'Reaction to a Retard' by Andrew Lansdown . A word I found particularly challenging as in my youth it, like many other words, was used in a derogatory or insulting context.

The importance of the poem is that it takes one into the heart of our human problem about recognising Gods image in each of his creatures. It linked in with the thrust of my Lent readings 'Embracing Justice by Isabel Hamley'.

In this challenging but wonderful book which explores concepts of justice and how the need to think about how I can communicate with the God within my enemy. Particularly relevant in today's world, although I imagine each age has its story to tell of conflict resolution. The language we use and words used can enable resolution or inflame hatred.

God is love and I am struggling to understand how my brother and sisters in Christ can abuse each other physically and verbally. Let alone accept the language used in our media which is so devoid of love and compassion. As I move forward I shall revisit the letters of James, part of Ephesians and the book of Proverbs as I grapple with the questions raised with me this past Lent.

And to finish the song' if you're in love show me'.
